Project Title: Milty's Realm/Door of Knowledge

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

- “*Milty*,” is a four and a half foot tall bronze statue of a pony, being fed an apple by a young boy while a happy little girl sits on his back.
- The sculpture shall serve as a meeting place in the entrance Plaza, positioned on an eighteen inch tall concrete base.
- “*Door of Knowledge*” will be placed as a “*Milty*” companion in the Plaza.
- The door is six and a half feet high and three feet wide. It will be modeled after the original home’s front door.




Project Title: Elemental Cloud

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

- **"Elemental Cloud"** is based on the dramatic color transformation of leaves through the changing seasons, symbolizing impermanence and rebirth.
"Elemental Cloud" uses copper and iron to create the organic gradation of color through controlled oxidation. Oxidation is the elemental underlying cause of the actual color change in plants.
- **"Elemental Cloud"** will be located in the Library Atrium and will be designed to complement the volume of the space.
